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**Appendix 1. Classification of dermatological disorders**


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1	Acne
2	Arthropod bites and stings
3	Birthmarks Includes infantile haemangiomas, sacral pits, congenital dermal melanocytosis
4	Bacterial skin infections (BSI) Includes impetigo (skin sores), carbuncles/furuncles (boils), cellulitis/erysipelas, acute bacterial paronychia, abscess, folliculitis
5	Cutaneous manifestations of systemic disease and nutritional deficiency Includes pallor associated with anaemia
6	Dermatitis Includes atopic dermatitis (eczema) and irritant contact dermatitis (diaper dermatitis, vulvovaginitis, balanitis, perioral contact dermatitis/food intolerance, irritant hand dermatitis) Excludes seborrhoeic dermatitis.
7	Dermatological disorders in newborns/infants Includes oral candida, neonatal cephalic pustulosis/neonatal acne, cutis marmorata
8	Dermatophyte (tinea) infections Includes tinea corporis (and tinea of other cutaneous sites), tinea capitis, onychomycosis
9	Disorders due to physical agents Includes thermal burn, sunburn, foreign body, blunt injury, lacerations, abrasions, animal bites
10	Lumps/bumps Includes epidermal cysts, milia, melanocytic naevi (moles), reactive lymph nodes
11	Onychocryptosis (ingrown nails)
12	'Other' skin infections Includes intertrigo, pityriasis versicolor, pediculosis capitis requiring GP management
13	Scabies
14	Seborrhoeic dermatitis (dandruff)
15	Viral skin infections Includes molluscum contagiosum, hand-foot-and-mouth disease, non-specific viral exanthem, herpes simplex virus, verruca vulgaris
16	Miscellaneous Includes keratosis pilaris, urticaria, hyperhidrosis, aphthous ulcers, immunisation site reactions
17	Uncertain dermatological diagnosis (descriptive terminology only in electronic medical record)

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
